Professional Advancement

Mental health professionals in the correctional environment face unique challenges. They must provide effective, efficient care to a high acuity population while facing strict security regulations, crowded facilities and the myriad legal and public health considerations unique to this specialty. To meet these challenges, continual professional growth is essential. Specialty certification provides formal recognition for practitioners who have engaged in a process of ongoing, focused and targeted professional development. Specialty certification in correctional mental health is a validation of your dedication to continuing competence and quality service delivery.

Eligibility Requirements

Eligibility is extended to all qualified mental health professionals as defined by the *Standards for Mental Health Services in Correctional Facilities* (2015), MH-A-02: "psychiatrists, psychologists, psychiatric social workers, licensed professional counselors, psychiatric nurse, or others who by virtue of their education, credentials, and experience are permitted by law to evaluate and care for the mental health needs of patients."

Prior to submitting an application, applicants must have:

- · Current CCHP certification
- · Graduate level (master's and above) degree
- Professional licensure within a U.S. state (for Canada and US territories, credentials will be reviewed on a case-by-case basis)
- · Equivalent of three years of full-time practice in a correctional environment

Get Started

Elements of the application:

- Copy of professional licensure or proof of license eligibility, e.g., copy of diploma, if license to practice is not required by law in your state
- · Signed application statement

Registration and Candidacy

Once the application has been approved, applicants will receive acknowledgment of their candidacy to take the CCHP-MH examination. Candidates must register before the registration deadline for the exam they wish to take.

Preparing for the Examination

The Examination

Candidates who meet the basic eligibility and application requirements will take a proctored examination composed of 80 to 100 multiple-choice questions. Candidates are allowed two hours to complete the examination.
